Play will begin at 8:00AM and will consist of as many matches as are required to complete the competition, immediately followed by a BBQ and the Shoot-Out.



### FORMAT



Four-Ball Match Play, each team playing five 9-hole matches over the two days. Three matches will be played on Friday and two matches will be played on Saturday. The field has been divided into flights based upon the combined handicap indexes of the partners. Flights 1-4 will play from Blue Tees (6200 yards) and the 5-7 will play from White Tees (5800 yards).

Gentlemen, please pick-up if you are out of the hole or if the result of the hole has been determined.

### HANDICAPS-

The low man in each four-ball match will play at scratch giving the full difference in strokes to each other member of the match. Since each match will be nine holes, you will receive one half of your handicap. Maximum handicap for the event is 36.

We will also be using "half a stroke" in the matches. For example, if your full handicap is a 20, your handicap for each nine-hole match would be 10. If the low handicap in your foursome is a 15, then his nine-hole handicap is 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ . Therefore, you would receive the difference of 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  strokes (10 minus 7  $\frac{1}{2}$ ) for the match. This would equate to receiving one stroke on each of the two highest ranked handicap holes and a  $\frac{1}{2}$  stroke on the third ranked handicap hole.

### SCORING

Scoring will be on a point system as follows:

- All nine holes of each match must be played.
- Each hole will be worth 1 point. A halve will be worth 1/2 point for each team.
- After nine holes, the team with the most points also receives an additional 1 point for winning the match. If the match is halved, each team will receive an additional ½ point.
- The total of points for both teams for each match will be 10.
- The team with the most points in each flight after all 5 matches will be the flight winner.

### MATCHES



Teams will receive the scorecards for matches 1, 2, & 3.

At the completion of match 1, drive to the starting hole highlighted on the scorecard for match 2 and wait for your opponents. The golf shop staff will drive the course to pick up the scorecards from the first match and then the second match. Teams will repeat the same procedure for matches 4 & 5 on Saturday.

### FLIGHT WINNERS

The team in each flight with the highest point total will be the Flight Winner and will compete in the Shoot-Out. The team in each flight with the second highest point total will be the Flight Runner Up. In the event of a tie for first (or second if applicable) place in a flight, the results of "Head-To-Head" competition within the Flight will determine the winner. If still tied, a chip-off will be conducted. Each team will choose one player to participate in the chip-off. The one closest to the hole will be the winner.

### "THE SHOOT-OUT"-

The winners of each flight qualify for the Shoot-Out to determine the 2020 Champions. The Shoot-Out will begin immediately following lunch on Saturday, approximately 1:00pm.

The Shoot-Out will take place from the 18th hole. The format will be alternate shot. Each team will choose which player will start the alternate shot. Flight Winners will play from the tee color their flight competed from. The team with the lowest score will be the tournament champion. If there is a tie, the teams that are tied will go back and play from 150 yards and then if still tied moved up in 25-yard (ei. 125, 100) increments to determine the winner.

### FATHER & SON CHAMPIONS-

The Father-Son team with the most points regardless of flight will receive the trophy. Ties will be decided by the team that won their flight. If both won their flight, the lowest net total after the Shoot-Out will determine the winner. If still tied, there will be a chip off to determine the winner.

> Only Father and son entrants are eligible, no other relative combinations.



### SPECIAL EVENTS



#### HAT POOL

Total amount bet in each Flight will be distributed to the first and second place teams. The total prize money will be distributed 1 st Place and 2nd Place.

#### CLOSEST TO PIN

Prizes on Thursday & Friday for Closest to the Pin on ALL Par 3's for Members and Guests.

### INCLEMENT WEATHER

- Under no circumstances will any of the social/dining portions of the event be cancelled. If weather prohibits or limits play on any day, all social and dining functions will go on as planned-possibly earlier than scheduled. Players will be notified of any time changes as quickly as possible.
- All players should come to Turtle Creek on Friday, and Saturday mornings for golf as scheduled even if the weather is poor. Any changes or cancellations of the matches will be announced at Turtle Creek.
- If the weather is poor and an entire section of times are unable to start play; each flight will only play four matches to determine the winner of the flight. This means you may not play a match against every other team in your flight.

### INCLEMENT WEATHER

- 4. If, for example, some flights have begun play and the course is declared unplayable, the results of the matches that are in progress will be determined by the status of the match who has played the least number of holes and all holes will be declared halved. If there is a case where some flights have begun play, and the remaining flights have not begun their matches, each team in those remaining flights will receive a halve for the match. (Both teams receive 5 points).
- 5. If golf is cancelled on Friday due to unplayable conditions, Saturday's matches will determine the flight winners and the Shoot-Out will go on as scheduled. If the Shoot-Out cannot be completed, the Tournament Committee will advise the procedure for naming an Overall Champion.
- 6. If matches are played on Friday and the course is declared unplayable for Saturday, the winners of the flights will be those teams leading after day one. If there are any flights with ties for the lead in this situation, the Tournament Committee will determine the procedure to follow. The Tournament Committee will also advise the procedure for naming an Overall Champion.
- 7. If the golf course is unplayable all days, all players will receive their gifts on arrival at the club on Thursday evening and the flight winners will be determined by a blind drawing during Saturday's Awards Presentation. No Overall Champion will be awarded.
- A "Rain Date" has been set for Sunday, January 26th. This date may be used for completion of matches and/or shootout if necessary, as determined by the Member-Guest Committee.

### LOCAL RULES

- 1. USGA governs all play
- 2. Out of bounds: Defined by white stakes
- 3. A ball coming to rest above the water's edge, on the private property side of a lateral water hazard, is out of bounds.
- Embedded ball rule is in effect. When your ball is embedded in sand in a part of the general area that is not cut to fairway height or less, free relief is not allowed.
- 5. The coquina shell areas are play it as it lies.
- 6. All unpaved clearly identifiable cart paths are played as through the green.
- All Penalty Areas are marked with red lines. Where bulkheads are present the Penalty Area is defined by the water side edge of the bulkheads. If there is no line, the water's edge marks the boundary.
- 8. Sprinkler heads around greens: If a sprinkler head, within 2 club lengths of the green and within 2 club lengths of the ball, interferes with a player's line to the hole, the ball may be dropped within 1 club length of the ball no nearer the hole without penalty.
- 9. Staked Trees, new tree wells, and concrete or paved cart paths: relief, stance and one club length, no nearer the hole.
- Irrigation boxes: Free relief from irrigation box and bushes surrounding the box. Take relief from stance or intended swing plus one club length, no nearer the hole.
- In the case of inclement weather, one elongated horn blast will halt play. Play will be resumed at the sound of three short horn blasts.
